

Funeral Undertakers Bylaws

- No corpses may be prepared outside of an undertaker's premises; in which case the undertaker is to have a certificate of competence.
- The Municipality may on written permission grant to an individual exemption from the bylaws if adhering to the bylaw will cause a nuisance.
- The bylaw lays down provisions for the issue or transfer as well as the validity of a certificate of competence given to a funeral parlour.
- There are duties that a holder of this certificate must comply with as well.
- The Municipality also has certain conditions that have been laid forth for the suspension or revocation of a certificate of competence.
- In terms of the premises of the funeral undertaker, there are certain provisions that the funeral undertaker must comply with for the funeral home.
- All health care as well as material that must be disposed of must be done so in accordance with South African National Standards.
- There are provisions for penalties for non-compliance.
- The bylaw is called **FUNERAL UNDERTAKERS BYLAWS.**
