This bid is subject to the general conditions of contract (GCC) and any other special conditions of contract.

THE FOLLOWING ARE MANDATORY: CSD summary report, valid tax clearance or SARS login pin, a certified copy of the most recent municipal account in which the business is registered, copies of ID of members of the entity, B-BBEE Certificate and Certified copy of CIPRO e.g. CK certificates. Bidders are requested to sign where necessary and initial each page on the Bid Documents.

This proposal will be evaluated in terms of the 80/20 Preferential Procurement Point system where 80 points are for functionality and price, and 20 points are for BBBEE according to the said legislation.

Late tenders will not be accepted, and the Ulundi Municipality reserved the right not to make an award. Failure to comply with the above conditions will invalidate your offer.

Pre-qualification conditions for a tenderer (PPPFA) Act 2000: Exempted Micro Enterprise (EME) or Qualifying Small Enterprise (QSE) which is at least 51% owned by black people who are women and 51% owned by black people living in rural or underdeveloped areas or townships.

Kindly note that the successful bidder will be subjected to a screening process prior to the bid being awarded, should it be discovered that a successful bidder provided misleading information he/she will be disqualified with immediate effect.

TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF PROFESSIONAL SERVICE PROVIDER TO UNDERTAKE THE BASIC ASSESSMENT AS PART OF THE WASTE MANAGEMENT LICENSE APPLICATION FOR THE CLOSURE OF BABANANGO LANDFILL SITE

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Invitation to submit proposals

- Proposals are invited from suitably qualified and experienced professional consultants and service providers to undertake the Basic Assessment and Waste Management License Application for closure of Babanango landfill site and rehabilitation plan.
- Please note that (i) the costs of preparing the proposal and of negotiating the contract are not reimbursable as a direct cost of the Evaluation; (ii) Ulundi Municipality is not bound to accept any of the Proposals submitted; (iii) The decision to award a contract is based on the requirements contained in the Procurement Policy of Ulundi Local Municipality. Again, service providers must familiarize themselves with the content of the Procurement Policy.
- Service providers may request a clarification of any part of the ToR documents up to the close of business on proposal submission date. A request for clarification must be sent in writing by mail, facsimile, or electronic mail to Ulundi Local Municipality.
- The Ulundi Municipality will respond by facsimile or electronic mail to such requests and will send copies of all responses to all service providers who registered to obtain copies of this ToR.

- At any time before the submission of Proposals, Ulundi Municipality may, for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by an invited firm, modify the ToR documents by amendment. The amendment will be sent in writing by facsimile or electronic mail to all registered consultants and will be binding on them. Ulundi Municipality may at its discretion extend the deadline for the submission of Proposals.
- The proposal should provide the following:
 - i. A brief description of the firm's methodology to perform the tasks set forth in the Terms of Reference, including a proposed work plan with clear deliverables and timeframes.
 - ii. A brief description of the firm's organization and an outline of recent experience in undertaking the Basic Assessment or Scoping and Environmental Impact Report assignments of Waste Management related activities. For each assignment, the outline should indicate, inter alia, the profiles and names of the staff provided, their qualifications, and duration of the assignment, contract amount, and firm's involvement.
 - iii. CV's of the proposed professional staff and the authorized representative submitting the proposal. Key information should include number of years working for the firm/entity, and degree of responsibility held in various assignments during the last ten (10) years.
 - iv. The firm's current make-up in terms of Previously Disadvantaged Individuals and its black empowerment goals and objectives in general and those specific to this project to be clearly spelt out.

2. FINANCIAL PROPOSAL

2.1 In preparing the financial proposal, service providers are expected to take into account the requirements and conditions of the Terms of Reference documents. The financial proposal should list all costs associated with the project.

2.2 Proposals must remain valid for 90-days after the submission date. During this period, service providers are expected to keep available the professional staff proposed for the project.

3. TIME FRAME OF THE PROJECT

All work associated with this project in terms of the ToR requirements must be completed within a set period of time as per environmental management guidelines. The proposals must include a work programme.

4. PURPOSE AND AIMS OF THE PROJECT

Ulundi Local Municipality is in a processing of licensing the Ulundi landfill for decommissioning (closure). Any activity identified in terms of Section 19 (1) of the NEM: Waste Act requires Waste Management Licence (WML) Application. In terms of the NEM: Waste Act, any person wishing to carry out a Category A activity is required to conduct a Basic Assessment Process, as stipulated in the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations made under Section 24(5) of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998) as part of a Waste Management Licence Application.

For this reason, a Decommissioning Licence must be applied for with the KwaZulu-Natal Department of Economic Development; Tourism and Environmental Affairs (EDTEA). The Municipality is seeking to appointment the Environmental Consultant to undertake Basic Assessment (BA) process and the Closure Plan for the Waste Management Licence Process for the Ulundi landfill as per the Environmental and Waste Management Legislations.

The Municipality proposes to formally decommission the Ulundi Babanango site. The Ulundi Babanango was operating without a licence and site activities were not undertaken according to the Minimum Requirements for Waste Disposal by Landfill (DWAF, 1998 2nd Edition), the National Environmental Management Waste Act (NEM:WA hereafter), 2008 (Act No. 59 of 2008) as well as any other environmental legislation. The proposed activities

associated with the decommissioning of the landfill site will however be undertaken according to required legislation.

Ulundi Municipality is one the five LMs, other four LMs being eDumbe, Abaqulusi, Nongoma and uPhongolo, constituting the Zululand District. It is located on the southern boundary of the Zululand District Municipality in the north-eastern part of KwaZulu-Natal. The municipal areas is approximately 3,250 km² in extent and includes the towns and settlements of Ulundi, Nqulwane, Mahlabathini, Babanango, Mpungamhlophe and Ceza as well as nine Traditional Authorities of Buthelezi, Mbatha, Mpungose, Ndebele, Nobamba, Ximba, Zungu, Nsimbi, Buthelezi-Emphithiphithini. It consists of 24 wards. The Ulundi LM is the administrative centre and seat for the Zululand District Municipality and a well-equipped airport.

5. OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT

- To ensure that the Babanango landfill is legally decommissioned.
- To assess the alternatives for the rehabilitation and closure of the site
- To identify any social and biophysical impacts from the proposed closure
- To provide the closure design of the landfill site, which will include:
 - Remedial design to address identified problem areas
 - Final shaping, landscaping and re-vegetation
 - Final landfill cover or cap design
 - Permanent storm water diversion measures, run off control and anti-erosion measures
 - Any infrastructure relating to the end-use plan

7. REPORTING REQUIREMENT

- 7.1 The service provider will act in close co-operation with Ulundi Local Municipality and will report to the Ulundi Local Municipality through the Community Services Director. The Department will assess and approve progress reports and related payments in terms of the contract.
- 7.2 The service provider will provide regular progress reports and sometimes at intervals determined by the Ulundi Local Municipality.
- 7.3 The service provider will report to the Municipal Manager of Ulundi Local Municipality when operating within their area of jurisdiction on this project.
- 7.4 An attendance registers and minutes must be kept of all meetings and interactions with stakeholders and submitted to the Ulundi Local Municipality as part of the progress reports.
- 7.5 The service provider shall hold regular meetings, the frequency of which will be determined at the project inception meeting and may be on the basis of project milestones. However, meetings between the service provider and Municipality's project manager may be requested from time to time at venues determined by Ulundi Local Municipality. The service provider shall provide the secretariat for all the meetings and workshop proceedings and minutes will be circulated.

- ✓ The Council does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender (tenders received are too high). e. The Ulundi Local Municipality will not be held responsible for any expenditure or losses incurred in submitting and complying with this tender nor of the visit to the site.
- ✓ The tender of any tenderer who has not conformed to the foregoing instructions will not be considered. When Council accepts a proposal, the successful tenderer will be informed, and the contract negotiated indicating the financial implications in the main being how and when payment will be made.

TAX CLEARANCE CERTIFICATE

- (n) **“price”** includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;
- (o) **“proof of B-BBEE status level of contributor”** means:
 - (i) the B-BBEE status level certificate issued by an authorised body or person;
 - (ii) a sworn affidavit as prescribed by the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice; or
 - (iii) any other requirement prescribed in terms of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- (p) **“QSE”** means a qualifying small business enterprise in terms of a code of good practice on black economic empowerment issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- (q) **“Rand value”** means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of the tender invitation;

- (r) **“rural area”** means:
 - (i) a sparsely populated area in which people farm or depend on natural resources, including villages and small towns that are dispersed through the area; or
 - (ii) an area including a large settlement which depends on migratory labour and remittances and government social grants for survival, and may have a traditional land tenure system;
